

PART-TIME JOBS WHILE STILL AT SCHOOL

- You cannot have a part-time job while you are at school until you are 13 years old
- If you work, you must have a work permit
- You must take 2 weeks' holiday each year (may not be paid)
- You can only work between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- You can work up to 2 hours on Sundays
- You can work up to 2 hours on school days
- You must not work more than 12 hours during a school week
- You must have a rest break of 1 hour after working for 4 hours

If you are aged 13 or 14 years

- You can work up to 5 hours on Saturdays
- You must not work more than 25 hours per week during school holidays and half term breaks

If you are aged 15 or 16 years

- You can work up to 8 hours on Saturdays
- You must not work more than 35 hours per week during school holidays and half term breaks

Work is:

'Any work that is part of a business whether or not the person is paid'
- (babysitting is not considered 'work' by the law as you are self-employed)

Be careful –

There are some jobs that school aged children may not do as they are dangerous.
