West Berkshire Council (WBC) is a unitary authority and so is responsible for minerals and waste planning for the authority. WBC also is a neighbouring authority of Oxfordshire County Council (OCC). It is acknowledged by both WBC and OCC that there are cross-boundary movements of minerals and waste between the two authority areas.

### **Duty to Cooperate**

As part of Local Plan preparation OCC and WBC cooperate with each other, engaging constructively, and actively on an ongoing basis, in the context of cross boundary strategic minerals and waste matters. It is envisaged that such dialogue will continue as OCC develops the Part 2: Sites Allocations document and as WBC continues to develop the emerging West Berkshire Minerals and Waste Local Plan.

#### Minerals

In paragraph 3.3(a) as part of the Vision, and in 3.4(iii) as part of the mineral planning objectives it is indicated that OCC will make an appropriate contribution to meeting the wider needs of aggregate minerals, recognising the strategic importance of the mineral resources in Oxfordshire. Acknowledging the likely ongoing cross-boundary movements of aggregate minerals between authorities, this approach is supported by WBC.

In particular WBC supports the acknowledgement that OCC will continue to be a net exporter of soft sand. This is of importance to WBC as the only soft sand reserves worked in West Berkshire in the last decade have been from sites located in the AONB. Although WBC is in the early stages of plan preparation, and it is unclear what strategy will be pursued in respect of mineral extraction from the AONB in the future, this commitment from OCC to seek to maintain a position of net exportation of soft sand may enable WBC to work with OCC, through the duty to cooperate, to develop a strategy whereby, to ensure the protection of the AONB, any level of unmet need that could be a consequence of the strategy adopted in WBC can be satisfactorily accommodated in neighbouring authority areas.

#### Waste

Waste Planning Objective i (paragraph 3.7) is centred on Oxfordshire being 'net self-sufficient' in terms of meeting its own needs in terms of waste management. Acknowledging the likely ongoing cross-boundary movements of waste between authorities, this approach is supported by WBC.

We note that 'Policy W6: Landfill' makes reference to existing non-hazardous landfill facilities providing for the disposal of waste from other areas (including


London and Berkshire) as required. Acknowledging the likely ongoing cross-boundary movements of residual waste for landfill between authorities, again this approach is supported by WBC.

The waste strategy that will be pursued in the emerging West Berkshire Minerals and Waste Development Plan Document remains in the early stages of development, and it is anticipated that a net self sufficient approach will be pursued. However, there is no longer any non hazardous landfill capacity in WBC and, due to the geological makeup of the authority, and lack of operator interest, it is predicted that it is unlikely that there will be any future non hazardous landfill capacity provided in the future. Therefore the acknowledgement that there will be an ongoing cross boundary movement of waste from West Berkshire to the landfill sites in Oxfordshire is welcomed. WBC would like to continue to discuss the potential for working with OCC, through the duty to cooperate, to ensure that WBC can develop a strategy whereby the level of unmet need for non hazardous landfill from WBC can be satisfactorily accommodated in neighbouring authority areas.

For the sake of clarity these comments are made at an officer level and there has been no member involvement in the compilation of this response.

However the planning policy member working group at WBC is aware of the development of the Oxfordshire Minerals and Waste Local Plan: Part 1 – Core Strategy and were involved in earlier comments provided by West Berkshire Council on the emerging plan. The comments in this response echo the earlier comments made by West Berkshire Council at the preferred options stage.
