Comments on the Oxfordshire Mineral and Waste Plan: Policy M3 by the Church Hanborough and Lower Evenlode Residents Group.

This is a joint response by residents of the village of Church Hanborough and Lower Evenlode. We refer to the area of the Evenlode valley north of the A40 up towards Long Hanborough. This is a thin finger of land some 2.2 miles long by 0.7 mile wide of attractive landscape adjacent to the River Evenlode. 20 residential dwellings and 2 farms are located here. In addition a nursery serving 60 children and 20 staff is situated in the middle of the zone. The site is adjacent to the village of Church Hanborough.

The representation form requests a response to whether the strategy is legally compliant and sound. We cannot respond to the legality of the strategy; however we believe that it is unsound on grounds of justification.

- 1. Existing and former sites of extraction within the County of Oxfordshire have been over proportionately allocated to West Oxfordshire. It is clearly acknowledged that future extraction should be allocated to sites elsewhere in the county.
- 2. It is also acknowledged that the requirement for such minerals has been achieved and sustainable until 2027.
- 3. We understand that the gravel density of the site is only 1/3 of that at other sites, making it much less economical to extract. In addition, the need for buffer zones round the 20 houses and nursery and along the sides of the road will make the quarries extremely narrow and difficult to work.
- 4. The site is distant from any of the Oxfordshire key growth points; this would result in long lorry movements that would involve Thames crossings.

# We also have some concerns specific to the area

### Transport:

Lower Road, which runs through the proposed site, is a bendy busy rural road with a series of entrances with poor visibility. This road is already under pressure from increased residential traffic owing to local housing developments and traffic cutting through escaping congestion elsewhere. The heavy lorry traffic resulting from new quarries would bring further congestion and hazards, particularly at the junctions

with other roads and entrances to residential dwellings and the nursery school, most of which are already dangerous. This road is totally unsuitable for heavy industrial traffic.

#### Landscape:

The land to the East of the road is Green Belt. To the West and abutting the site is the conservation area of the village of Church Hanborough. The valley, which is adjacent to the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty has an attractive rural landscape with rolling hills looking onto the unspoilt Evenlode valley. The settlements of Church and Long Hanborough look down onto it. Because of that, and the narrowness of the site and proximity to the road, the proposed gravel extraction would be excessively visually intrusive throughout the valley and would irrevocably destroy the landscape.

#### Amenity:

The noise, dust, vibration and air pollution from the quarry working will seriously affect the amenity and possibly health of the local residents who live within and adjacent to the site. In addition the health of 60 small children at the nursery school will be affected.

#### **Ecology:**

This part of the winding Evenlode valley with its adjacent ancient woods (Pinsley, Burleigh) and meadows and hedgerows provides important habitats for many declining species like bats, moorhen, a variety of ducks, including pintail, shelduck, wigeon, and red-crested pochard, kingfishers, great crested grebe, little egrets and migratory geese, kestrels, buzzards, owls and also water voles, otters, stoats and roe deer and many others. These habitats would be irreversibly destroyed by the sand and gravel extraction.

In conclusion, we believe that the proposed mineral extraction is unjustified and hazardous to the local community. Quarrying in this zone will be damaging to the landscape, make the road more hazardous, endanger the amenity and health of the residents and the nursery children and interfere with the ecology of the area, while at the same time being of limited utility. We therefore ask that this zone be removed from consideration for sand and gravel quarrying.
