Oxfordshire Minerals & Waste Local Plan : Part 1 – Core Strategy Submission Document – on Behalf of Tarmac

- We are instructed by Tarmac, the operators of Sonning Quarry and the Hennet Way Rail Dept at Banbury, to prepare and submit representations in respect of the above document. It is noted that the Core Strategy will ultimately be accompanied by the Site Allocations DPD, which will provide a strategic context for minerals and waste development through until 2031.
- No comments are offered on Chapter 1 of the document. Chapter 2 sets out a clear and succinct portrait of the current situation of the natural and built environment within the County. The chapter confirms the National Context of Planning Policy and does include reference to the National Planning Policy for Waste. The chapter makes reference to the Waste Hierarchy and the fundamental role this plays in managing waste arisings.
- Tarmac would point out that the use of inert materials, as a recovery operation in the restoration of mineral working, is a key tool in sustainable site restoration. The National Policy for waste encourages developers and authorities to "seek recovery opportunities". This approach dovetails with other national and European legislation on waste recovery and disposal.
- 4. The chapter goes on to set out some of the key issues for minerals and waste planning within the County. The fourth bullet point in paragraph 2.44 provides a generic context for the location of future mineral workings. It is considered that it needs to include appropriate reference to national designations (such as the AONB) to ensure that their protection is acknowledged at the outset.
- 5. It is considered that, consistent with point 3 above, the eighth bullet point of the same paragraph could be amended to include clear reference to the use of inert materials as a recovery activity in the sustainable restoration of mineral workings.

- 6. Under the waste policy strategic issues, clear reference needs to be provided to ensure that inert waste arisings are targeted towards the sustainable restoration of mineral workings to ensure the maximum benefit of this resource material.
- 7. Chapter 3 of the document considers the vision and objectives for minerals and waste planning in Oxfordshire for the plan period. It is considered that the Minerals Planning vision does not place sufficient emphasis on the great weight of benefit that mineral extraction can provide both in land use planning terms and in terms of economic performance. The vision also needs to establish the scope for cross border relationships, both for minerals supply and waste management, whilst maintaining self-sufficiency in primacy. The sustainable supply of minerals is and should be a key component of the document.
- 8. In respect of the restoration element of the vision ((c) of paragraph 3.3), clearer reference could be made to the use of progressive restoration techniques and the creation of new, high quality, distinctive landscapes. Projects such as the operations at Sonning/Caversham, both past and present, are an examplar with these themes in mind. The objectives defined in paragraph 3.4 carry some of these themes through.
- Paragraph 3.6 of the plan sets out the Waste Planning Vision. Again, Tarmac would wish to point out the role that inert waste recovery can play in the sustainable restoration of mineral workings
- 10. Chapter 10 of the document sets out the minerals planning strategy which is mainly the spatial framework to deliver the steady and adequate supply of minerals to the market. Tarmac support the policy content on recycling and recognise the benefit that co-location can bring to schemes.
- 11. In relation to minerals supply and Policy **M2**, Tarmac are pleased to note the terminology of "at least" has been set out. This more open-ended approach will enable minerals developers to deliver a full range of schemes to support a prosperous local and regional economy, without the issue of prematurity slowing proposals down.
- 12. Tarmac wholly supports the content of Policy M3: Principal Locations for Working Aggregate Minerals and Policy M4: Sites for Working Aggregates Minerals. These policies provide a clear spatial strategy, channelling minerals development to acceptable locations within a wider framework of spatial constraints.
- 13. The chapter goes on to consider the use of imported aggregate and rail depots. The content of Policy M6 is generally supported; however the policy does not do enough to protect potential locations (as per the NPPF and the Minerals PPG). Tarmac is pleased to note and support the safeguarding content at Policies M7 and M8.
- 14. However, in respect of Policy M9: Safeguarding Mineral Infrastructure, whilst the supporting text refers to potential assets, the policy itself is not clear about what assets (existing, planned or potential) are safeguarded. At the very least, major assets such as coated stone and ready mixed concrete plants need to be identified now to provide the minerals industry and, more particularly, the wider development industry with a clear picture of the distribution and importance of such assets.
- 15. The chapter goes on to consider the restoration and after use of mineral workings and recognises the major environmental benefits that successfully implemented restoration schemes can deliver. It is noted that the chapter is predicated towards a biodiversity-led system, but this should not be at the expense of delivery on sustainable landscaped landform or at the expense of the sustainable husbandry of soils resources, in particular those identified as Best and Most Versatile. It is suggested that Policy M10 needs amendment to include these two key elements in clearer terms.
- 16. Chapter 5 of the document considers the Waste Planning Strategy, with the waste hierarchy and management of municipal waste forming the key elements of Policy. Paragraph 5.20

- appropriately refers to the use of excavation waste in disposal and recovery, and this approach is supported by Tarmac.
- 17. Tarmac is pleased to note the balanced approach on recycling and restoration in the management of CDE materials as detailed in Policy **W2**. This approach is also successfully articulated in Policy **W6**, which prioritises the use of inert materials in the restoration of mineral workings, be it as a recovery or a disposal activity.
- 18. Chapter 6 sets out the Core Policies for Minerals and Waste Development. Tarmac would support Policy C1 which covers the important national policy-led theme of sustainable development.
- 19. After considering climate change, the chapter goes on to consider flooding matters which is key in the flood plain of the River Thames in particular. Paragraph 6.10 importantly recognises that sand and gravel working is water-compatible development. The stepped approach to landfill (which is taken to include the restoration of mineral workings even by recovery methods) is noted to be in general accordance with the Flooding and Coastal Change PPG. The sequential approach to site design needs to be recognised in Policy C3: Flooding, as it is a key tool in the design and delivery of a sustainable restoration scheme.
- 20. No comments are offered in respect of the remainder of Chapter 6 or the contents of Chapter 7.
- 21. Finally, Tarmac would wish to confirm that they will be continuing to promote the allocations at Sonning/Caversham (Site SG11) as well as other potential allocations within the "Thames Valley Area from Caversham to Shiplake" Strategic Resource Area highlighted in Policy M3.
