Historic England notes that Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty and Special Areas of Conservation have been excluded from the identified strategic resource areas, but it is also Government policy that local planning authorities should, as far as practical, provide for the maintenance of landbanks of non-energy minerals from outside World Heritage Sites, Scheduled Monuments and Conservation Areas (paragraph 144 of the National Planning Policy Framework).

We therefore consider that the Blenheim Palace World Heritage Site, Scheduled Monuments and Conservation Areas should also be excluded from the strategic resource areas. We note from paragraph 4.44 of the Plan that working within these areas is not necessary, so there is no need to include them within the strategic resource areas. We would also welcome the exclusion of Registered Historic Parks and Gardens.

In identifying search areas for sharp sand and gravel, reference is made in paragraph 4.35 to the fact that potentially important archaeological constraints have been identified in the Lower Windrush Valley, south of Hardwick, and at a number of locations within the Thames and Lower Thames Valleys (Oxford to Cholsey) strategic resource areas, but there is no indication that any more detailed assessment of these archaeological constraints has been undertaken (although we understand that an assessment of potential sites in the Lower Windrush Valley was undertaken some three years ago).

Nor is there is an indication of any consideration having been given to the importance of the archaeology in these search areas in a national and regional context (although not all the archaeological remains in these strategic resource areas are scheduled, they may be demonstrably be of equivalent significance to scheduled monuments and therefore should be considered subject to the policies for designated heritage assets in accordance with paragraph 139 of the National Planning Policy Framework).

Paragraph 126 of the National Planning Policy Framework requires local planning authorities to set out in their Local Plan a positive strategy for the conservation and enjoyment of the historic environment and in doing so to recognise that heritage assets are an irreplaceable resource and conserve them in a manner appropriate to their significance. Paragraph 132 requires, when considering the impact of a proposed development on the significance of a designated heritage asset, great weight to be given to the asset's conservation. Paragraph 157 requires local plans to identify areas where development would be inappropriate because, for example, of their environmental or historical significance.

One of the purposes of the Local Plan itself must be to ensure that minerals extraction only takes place in sustainable locations, which would be those where there would not be unacceptable adverse impacts on the historic environment, including important archaeological remains. Historic environments and the heritage assets therein should be given appropriate protection through the Local Plan Part 1 by its exclusion of scheduled and non-scheduled archaeologically sensitive areas from strategic resource areas, or at least the recognition that these archaeological remains should be protected and therefore are a constraint in the selection of extraction sites in the Local Plan Part 2.

In the earlier consultation in August 2010 we advised on the inclusion of the Lower Windrush Valley, and noted that this had been described as 'one of the finest series of successive landscapes in Southern England'. We advised that this area should be protected from further extraction. Subsequently we advised on specific nominated sites within that area, which formed a much smaller proportion of the wider area then identified, and accepted that some extraction on these specific sites might be acceptable. In February 2014, with the reversion of the Plan's approach to broad areas of search and an absence of identified sites, we again advised that the Lower Windrush Valley should be protected from further extraction.

We note that the current approach is a return to site allocations being identified separately from the Core Strategy in a proposed Local Plan Part 2 Site Allocations document. In accordance with our previous position regarding sites in the Lower Windrush Valley, some sites may be acceptable. We will, of course, have an opportunity to comment on any proposed mineral extraction sites in this strategic resource area (and we would be pleased to advise informally on potential sites) with the Local Plan Part 2, but we consider that the Core Strategy should express greater recognition of the archaeological significance of the Lower Windrush Valley and the constraint on extraction sites that this represents.

The Thames and Lower Thames Valleys (Oxford to Cholsey) strategic resource area is in effect four large separate sub-areas. It is difficult to ascertain what, if any, designated assets these sub-areas contain due to the scale of Figure 9, but the four areas appear to be much the same as the Area of Search in the previous Consultation Draft. In commenting on that document we noted that the Area contained a number of scheduled monuments, which we consider should be excluded from the strategic resource area and clearly identified as such (see our comments on paragraph 4.24 of the Local Plan).

The areas shown on Figure 9 at Drayton St Leonard and north-west of Benson are approximately equivalent to an area which was given within Option 2 of the Revised Mineral Spatial Strategy Options in 2010. We advised then that the area around Drayton St Leonard was worthy of protection within any strategic plan, and that the area contained prehistoric ceremonial complexes which were probably of national importance. They might therefore fall within the meaning of paragraph 139 of the National Planning Policy Framework and should be subject to the same policies as for designated assets.

The area shown on figure 9 and centred on Long Wittenham contains three extensive scheduled areas) and approximately equates to the Culham/Clifton Hampden/Dorchester area of which we said in 2010:

'The evidential value of this area is high, and the area from Appleford eastwards to Long Wittenham and northwards to the river is an important and intact multi-period archaeological landscape, the integrity of which should not be compromised'.

Again, the area may contain archaeological remains which are potentially of demonstrably equivalent significance to scheduled monuments and may fall within the meaning of paragraph 139 of the NPPF. We consider that the Core Strategy should express greater recognition of the archaeological significance of the Thames and Lower Thames Valleys and the constraint on extraction sites that this represents.

Defining strategic resource areas in the broad way the Core Strategy does, without giving any indication of the presence of serious constraints covering substantial parts of some of them is, we believe, unhelpful and potentially misleading. This failure, in our view, to give adequate protection to the important archaeological resources of the Lower Windrush Valley and Thames and Lower Thames Valleys strategic resource areas, is contrary to paragraphs 126, 132 and potentially 139 and 157 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

Historic England therefore considers that paragraph 4.35 should be revised to give greater recognition to, and protection of, the important archaeological resources of the Lower Windrush Valley and Thames and Lower Thames Valleys strategic resource areas, as part of the positive strategy for the conservation and enjoyment of the historic environment, taking into account, inter alia, the desirability of sustaining and enhancing the significance of heritage assets, which paragraph 126 of the NPPF requires local planning authorities to set out in their Local Plans.

Historic England considers that paragraph 4.35 should be reworded as follows:

"The Lower Windrush Valley, south of Hardwick is of particular archaeological significance, having been described as 'one of the finest series of successive landscapes in Southern England'. The Thames and Lower Thames Valleys (Oxford to Cholsey) are also of particular archaeological significance. Both strategic resource areas quite possibly contain archaeological remains which, whilst not scheduled, are demonstrably of equivalent importance to scheduled monuments and which should therefore be accorded the same protection as these designated heritage assets in accordance with the National Planning Policy Framework.

In accordance with the protection afforded by the National Planning Policy Framework to designated heritage assets (and those of demonstrably equivalent significance), and with minerals planning objective viii of the Core Strategy, these important archaeological resources should be conserved and enhanced and is a therefore a significant constraint on extraction in these strategic resource areas.

The Council will undertake further detailed assessment of this archaeological resource, with Historic England, to ensure that this important archaeology is given appropriate protection, in particular when sites for mineral working are allocated in the Site Allocations document."

It is difficult to ascertain what, if any, designated assets the strategic resource areas shown in Figure 9 contain due to its scale, but areas 4 - 8 appear to be largely the same as the six Areas of Search in the previous Consultation Draft.

The Thames Valley – Caversham to Shiplake strategic resource area appears to largely equate to the former North-East of Caversham Area of Search, which included the Sonning Eye Conservation Area and a number of listed buildings.

The Thames and Lower Thames Valley (Oxford to Cholsey) strategic resource area appears to largely equate to the former Thames Valley (Oxford to Goring Gap) Area of Search, which included a number of scheduled monuments. In commenting on the Consultation Draft we noted that the areas at Drayton St Leonard and north-west of Benson are approximately equivalent to an area which was given within Option 2 of the Revised Mineral Spatial Strategy Options in 2010. We advised then that the area around Drayton St Leonard was worthy of protection within any strategic plan, and that the area contained prehistoric ceremonial complexes which were probably of national importance, and which might therefore fall within the meaning of paragraph 139 of the National Planning Policy Framework and should be subject to the same policies as for designated assets.

We also noted that the sub-area centred on Long Wittenham contained three extensive scheduled areas and approximately equates to the Culham/Clifton Hampden/Dorchester area of which we said in 2010:

'The evidential value of this area is high, and the area from Appleford eastwards to Long Wittenham and northwards to the river is an important and intact multi-period archaeological landscape, the integrity of which should not be compromised'.

We also noted that the Area also contains a number of other designated heritage assets: the Mackney and Long Wittenham Conservation Areas, part of two others and many listed buildings

The Thames, Lower Windrush and Evenlode Valleys – Standlake to Yarnton strategic resource area appears to largely equate to the former Eynsham/Cassington/Yarnton and Lower Windrush Areas of Search. In commenting on the Consultation Draft we noted that the former includes part of the Church Harborough Conservation Area and abuts the Eynsham Conservation Area, and includes a number of listed buildings.

For the Lower Windrush Valley, in the earlier consultation in August 2010 we noted that this had been described as 'one of the finest series of successive landscapes in Southern England'. In commenting on the Consultation Draft we noted that it identified a wider area which includes Hardwick and Northmoor Conservation Areas and part of Ducklington Conservation Area and numerous listed buildings.

The Corallian Ridge strategic resource area appears to largely equate to the former Corallian Ridge Area of Search, which included a large number of designated heritage assets:

- the Scheduled Ancient Monuments of Cherbury Camp, Site north-east of Noah's Ark Inn, Frilford and settlement site north of Cow Lane, Marcham;
- the Registered Historic Parks and Gardens of Pusey House and Hinton Manor;
- the Conservation Areas of Shellingford, Littleworth, Cumnor, Appleton, Fyfield, Netherton, Longworth and Hinton Waldrist; and a great many listed buildings.

In commenting on the Consultation Draft we also noted that The Area of Search also included part of the Faringdon Conservation Area and was adjacent to the Stanford-in-the-Vale and Buckland Conservation Areas and Buckland House Registered Park and Garden (Grade II*).

Mineral extraction may destroy archaeological features and affect hydrology, which may affect the preservation of other archaeological features although outside the area of extraction. Extraction may also have other adverse impacts on the significance of other heritage assets.
