We support the Vision and Objectives, particularly the provision for a steady and adequate supply of minerals over the Plan period, and the clear recognition that Oxfordshire will make an appropriate contribution to meeting the wider needs for aggregates beyond the County boundary.

While the provision to maintain landbanks of reserves over the Plan period is supported, there appears to be a lack of attention to the need to maintain and increase the capacity to provide aggregates to the market, in order to maintain a steady and adequate supply. Current productive capacity ie the amount of aggregate that physically can be put through quarry gates, is below the annual average level of supply that is provided for in Policy

Objective (ii) could helpfully therefore refer to making provision for a steady and adequate supply ..."through ensuring sufficient reserves and productive capacity are permitted. This is addressed further in our representations on specific policies where we consider this to be an issue of soundness (not Effective).

While we <u>support</u> the level of provision reflecting the LAA (which properly takes account of local information affecting the long term average of aggregates sales in Oxfordshire and so is above the 10-year average) the policy only focuses on maintenance of landbanks of reserves and does not, in our view, adequately provide for an increase, and thereafter maintenance, of productive capacity in order to achieve an steady and adequate supply of aggregates.

Our members advise us that current capacity to supply is around 800,000 tonnes and so is below the annual average level of provision necessary to maintain a steady and adequate supply as set out in para 4.19. While provision for adequate landbanks of reserves is required by national policy and is supported, on its own this won't necessarily deliver a steady and adequate supply if the amount of material that actually can be provided to the market is limited, for example by physical constraints or restrictions imposed by planning conditions.

The *maintenance* of landbanks throughout the Plan period means that at the end of the Plan period there will need to be reserves equivalent to the supply of at least 7 years of sand and gravel and 10 years of rock. Based on the figures in the LAA and paragraph 4.14 this means that additional reserves of sharp sand and gravel and soft sand need to be provided for, above those indicated in paras 4.19, 7.5 and Table 2 - the total requirement in Row B will need to increase by 7.1mt of sharp sand and gravel and 1.3mt of soft sand. Adequate sites will then need to be allocated in the Site Allocations Document to provide for this amount of aggregates.

Given that current productive capacity/capacity to supply is insufficient to deliver the annual average amounts of land won supply (reflecting the LAA) there will be a need to maintain productive capacity in the West of the County while increasing productive capacity in the South which will still achieve the change in 'balance' between supply from these areas as proposed in para 4.30 and the policy (b). This is required to make the Plan effective.

Clause (h) - the 'avoidance' of locations within or significantly affecting AONBs appears to be to absolute and does not reflect the NPPF which requires that consideration be given to the need for development and the impact of refusing it on the local economy, the cost of and scope for developing elsewhere, and the potential to moderate detrimental effects are taken into account (para 116). Specific to minerals, para 144 requires that provision for maintenance of landbanks is made outside of AONBs 'as far as is practical.' Other clauses eg (k) provide flexibility and include provision for adverse effects to be suitably mitigated.

Clause (I) erroneously refers to 'successive' mineral development as contributing to cumulative effects. The NPPF (para 143) refers to taking into account 'the cumulative effects of multiple impacts from individual sites and/or a number of sites in a locality '. Our interpretation is that it applies to the cumulative effects of a number of sites operating at the same time within a locality, not to the operation of different sites over time.

Acknowledge in supporting text (para 4.30) that a change in the balance of production capacity between the West and the South of the County can be achieved through increasing production capacity in the South without reducing the production capacity in the West. An overall increase in production capacity is required to ensure that a steady and adequate supply is maintained and that the levels of production set out in the Plan (para 4.14) and the LAA are achieved, and to ensure the Plan is effective.

Clause (h) should be caveated to provide necessary flexibility and include reference to avoidance of these locations 'where practical' and where significant effects occur that these can be 'moderated', to make consistent with national policy.

Policy M7 requires quarries for Building Stone having to be 'small scale'. This is not defined or justified.

If the aim of the policy is to reduce environmental (principally landscape) and amenity impacts of extraction, and also processing and/or transport, then this should be clarified. The impacts of stone quarries, and the significance and acceptability of these impacts, as for other types of mineral or any other development, will depend on the location, design, operation and management of the quarry, including mitigation. The NPPF (para 144) provides specific advice on building stone quarries, stressing the small-scale nature and impact of such operations, and the need for a flexible approach to their working.

The reference to 'small scale' in Policy C8 appears to refer to development that is not 'major' and which is required to meet local needs. There is no need to make additional reference to undefined 'small-scale' quarries.

The reference in Policy C10 to development leading to a 'need improvement to the transport network' and 'developers will be expected to provide such improvement or make an appropriate financial contribution' is vague in terms of how such needs might be demonstrated and how financial contributions may be calculated. Minerals operators already make substantial contributions towards transport including through taxation and expenditure related to specific legal agreements and should not be expected to pay additional commuted funds for maintenance of highways, where the marginal effect of quarry-related traffic is not proven.
