OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (THAMES 200, MAPLEDURHAM) (SPECIAL EVENT) ORDER 2024

WHEREAS the Oxfordshire County Council ("the Council") is satisfied that vehicular traffic in certain roads, for road safety reasons should be temporarily prohibited to facilitate the holding of the `Thames 200, Mapledurham` ("The Event"). The Council is satisfied that it is not appropriate for the event to take place wholly off road.

NOW THEREFORE the Council, in exercise of its powers under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and all other enabling powers make the following Order.

- 1. Save as provided by Article 2 of this Order, no person shall when and where appropriate signage is in place, other than under the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause a vehicle to proceed or wait in:
 - 1) The road from the B4526 Reading Road (Goring Heath) south-eastwards to Sheepways Lane (Trench Green);
 - 2) Mill Lane, southwards from the above road to Mapledurham Road;
 - 3) On Mapledurham Road from the village north-eastwards to Mill Lane ("the Sections of Roads").
- Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause a vehicle to proceed in the Sections of Roads, subject to the safety and progress of the Event if the vehicle is being used:
 - (i) for the purpose of police, fire or ambulance services;
 - (ii) in connection with utility services or other works in, on or adjacent to the road, or on any land adjacent to the road;
 - (iii) by authorised officials responsible for safety of the event;
 - (iv) for access to property only accessible from the closed sections of road.
- This Order may be cited as the Oxfordshire County Council (Thames 200, Mapledurham) (Special Event) Order 2024 and shall have effect only on 14 September 2024.
