Endings / New Beginnings

SATs – We are sure all Year 6 parents/carers breathed a huge sigh of relief when the SATs tests were completed. We are proud of every child and sincerely hope everything went as well as it could have done.

Transition Visits/PEPs for Year 6s – June and July are hugely important months for Year 6s. Staff in primary and secondary schools will hopefully already have made arrangements to attend Term 6 PEPs to plan a smooth transition. All care-experienced children, especially Years 6s, really benefit from extra visits to their new school, photos of key staff and information about routines, what to bring, timetables and what to expect.

GCSE and Post-16 exams – The exam season is fully underway / nearly over. Exams are stressful for everyone, but especially for young people with instability and uncertainty in their lives. Please reach out to school staff if your child is struggling – we are also here to advise and support, if needed. If things don't quite go to plan, please reach out to school staff or your child's Virtual School worker – there are people to pro-actively support regarding best possible next steps.

Youth Voices (formally Children in Care Council, CiCC) is the new forum for Children We Care For (CWCF) and Care Leavers. Youth Voices help the council achieve our commitment to CWCF and care-experienced young people in Oxfordshire. Youth Voices have regular meetings, run surveys and access a range of enrichment activities that support us in working alongside them to better understand their needs and aspirations. Youth Voices hold the council, as Corporate Parent, to account against its commitment.

It is also a good time to encourage your child, if they are in Year 10, to attend Open Days/Events to start getting some ideas for their Post-16 options. Any Year 10s with EHCPs should have their Annual Review in the Summer Term to start considering Post-16 providers.

Care to Dance is a social enterprise that supports care-experienced young people through dance, led by Qualified Social Workers and Dancers. The combination of Social Work and Dance provides a holistic approach in supporting those who have experienced trauma.

Care to Dance is an opportunity for young people aged 7-24 who want to learn different styles of dance, including hip hop and breaking workshops, and is held Every Monday: 7-12 year olds: 5-6pm 12-24 year olds: 6-7pm Rose Hill Community Centre. 12-24 year olds have an opportutnity to gain Level 1 and 2 Dance Leadership Qualifications.

Pupil Premium Plus for Previously Cared for Children

The 2024/25 Pupil Premium Plus (PP+) allocation for children adopted from care, children who left care under a Special Guardianship Order (SGO) and children who left care under a Child Arrangement Order (CAO) is £2570.

For settings to access this PP+ for Previously Cared For Children (where a child has not returned to their birth parents), they need to be informed by those with Parental Responsibility (PR) that the child is subject to an Adoption, Special Guardian or other Child Arrangement Order so that they can input this onto their system in advance of the January census. Without this information, the money won't be received from the Department of Education.
